



## THE HIGH CALL

Now is indeed the time, to press onward toward the High Call in God. Paul tells us in Philippians 3:14, "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Paul exhorted us to press onward toward that HIGH call. Obviously there must be multiple calls on every believers life or he wouldn't have to identify the HIGH call. If there is a high call, there must be a low call, but he exhorts us to press on to the high call. Here in North America, like no where else in the world, believers are being attacked by distraction, discouragement, and busyness – all trying to move us into a place of compromise. The only way and the only place that you and I can pursue the High Call in God is in the undivided heart. Tuned perfectly to His plan and his purpose.

This was sent to me today by a wonderful friend of mine and was a divine confirmation:

### **An Undivided Heart**

Psalm 86:11–12 Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name. I will praise you, O Lord my God, with all my heart. (NIV)

The psalmist there focuses on one thing that is necessary if we are to walk God's way successfully.

First of all, he cries out, "Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth." We cannot walk in God's way unless God in His mercy teaches us that way. And then he says, "Give me an undivided heart." And a little later he says, "I will praise you, O Lord my God, with all my heart."

Notice the emphasis on the heart: "an undivided heart," "with all my heart." That's so important that we don't have a divided heart, that our heart is totally yielded to God, that it's focused on God. We have no second loyalties; we have no options. All our springs are in God; all our expectations are from God.

I've discovered in the Christian life, the further you go in God the fewer the options. The way becomes narrower and narrower and ultimately those who come to the end of the course are those who find their total satisfaction in God. It's not God plus something; it's God alone. That's an undivided heart – when we don't look anywhere but in God for our life, our satisfaction, our peace.
